Volunteers Wanted for Vision Research

Volunteers are needed between the ages of **18 and 75** years to participate in a research study assessing impact of eye occlusion on visual function with age.

The study will a single test session of approximately 2 hours in duration.

During the sessions, the following will be performed:

- (1) An eye examination to determine whether you are eligible to participate in the study,
- (2) A series of computer-based vision tests where you are required to respond to visual patterns presented on a computer screen.

Volunteers will be reimbursed \$20 per session in the form of a gift voucher to contribute towards any out of pocket expenses incurred in attending.
